In Case You Missed It, at our recent meeting, we had the privilege of hearing from Charles Emerson "Chuck" Johnson, a 91-year-old retired engineer, educator, and public historian with a career that bridges science, aerospace, and historical preservation. Chuck shared stories from his early days working alongside automotive pioneer Charles F. Kettering at the C.F. Kettering Research Laboratory. He later led engineering work supporting the NASA Apollo program through partnerships with Aerojet General, SysteMed Corporation, and UC Irvine.

Chuck also revealed his current focus: restoring one of Kettering's original renewable wind energy experiments. He continues to write manuscripts and develop digital exhibits based on decades of research. One highlight is his revitalization proposal for Paul Laurence Dunbar's Oak & Ivy Park, which he mentioned in his talk, "PLD's Oak & Ivy Park: A Vision."

We also welcomed *Laura Carlson*, Director of the Kettering Democracy Prize at the Charles F. Kettering Foundation. She introduced the foundation's mission to strengthen democracy worldwide and shared news about the inaugural Democracy Prize, set for November 2025. Honorees include racial justice advocate Judith Browne Dianis and, posthumously, Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny, both recognized for their courage and commitment to democratic values.

Celebrating 250 Years of History of Women in the Military

Women have served with, and in, the military since the Revolutionary War, although until World War I, they were many times forced to disguise their true identity. Once America entered the "War to end all wars" women were finally allowed to serve as clerks, radio operators and telephone swithc board operators. More women joined the military as nurses during this time as well. With the attack on Pearl Harbor the role of women in the military exploded, with women now flying aircraft, serving as instructors, and ultimately workingh on Top Secret projects such as the "Bombe" decoding machine developed and built in Dayton.

With the Korean War and Vietnam War, the role of women continued to expland to a certain degree. However, while there were women's organizations as part of the military (WACs, WAVES, and WAFs) they were not allowed to serve in combat or command men. Pregnancy was the cause for involuntary discharge.

By the end of the Vietnam War, many of these restrictions were lifted, with the exception of the ability to serve in combat roles. This was essentially a moot point as the nature of warfare began to change. From the invasion of Panama and Grenada to Operation DESERT STORM women took on leadership roles in combat, even though technically not allowed to do so.

After September 11^{th} , virtually all restrictions for female service members were done away with. In environments where there are essentially no front lines, and dealing with insurgencies made any such restriction useless.

Throughout the past 250 years women have gone from serving in secret to leading their services as 4-star Generals and Flag Officers; their journey fraught with stereotypes, chauvinism, and at times plain ignorance. They've overcome these obstacles and shown they have always been up to the task of preserving and defending the freedoms we all enjoy today.
